New to sewing? Here's a quick & easy project--just a few seams and you are done. Use 2 colors of lightweight knit for a color blocked look. Have fun experimenting with color combinations.

Materials

- Coats Dual Duty XP Fine to match fabric
- Light weight knit fabric, 54" – 60" wide- ¼ yard of two colors.

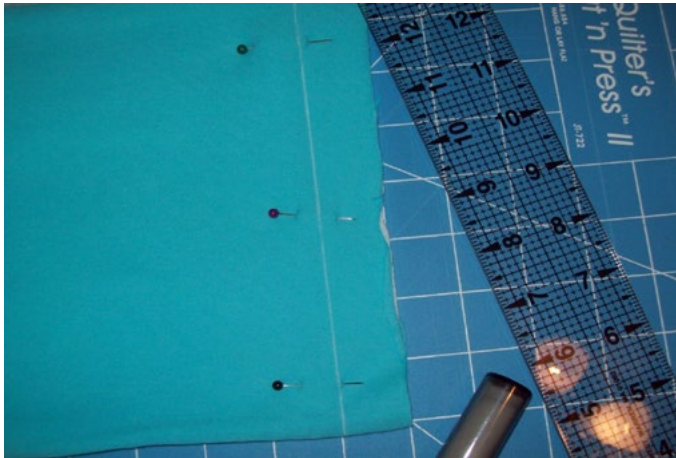

Two-Tone Scarf

Instructions

1. Trim the selvage edge from both ends of the knit fabric and use the entire width (9") for the scarf.
2. With right sides together stitch the long edges together to create a long tube. Use the left edge of the presser foot as a seam guide. Turn right sides out.
3. Press the fabric tube for a nice even edge.
4. Pin open edges together. Mark a 1" seam allowance across the edge with tailor's chalk. Stitch along chalk line with a slightly longer stitch since you will be sewing through 4 layers of fabric.



5. Open the seam. Trim away $\frac{3}{4}$ " of the left seam



6. Fold the untrimmed seam allowance over and under the trimmed seam. Pin in place.

7. Sew close to the fold opposite the other seam. This will give you a nice finished edge to your scarf. This is called a felled seam.



The finished scarf is a long loop measuring approximately 27 inches long.
To wear just place scarf over your head with the felled seam in the back. Twist to make another loop to go over your head.
